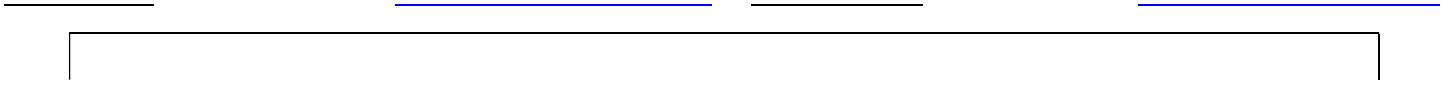

We are honored that your child has expressed an interest in trying out for a high school cheerleading squad in the Eagle Mountain Saginaw ISD school district and we hope this extraordinary choice proves to be a wonderful experience for each participant. The following information should be taken into consideration when making the decision to give your child permission to try out for the Saginaw High School Cheerleading Team

Expenses are based on initial fees, competition fees, and miscellaneous expenses incurred throughout the year. Initial expenses include, but are not limited to, summer camp practice clothes, shoes, warmups, uniforms, bagpack, megaphone, and accessories. Competition fees include, but are not limited to, travel expenses which may include hotel, transportation, meals, entry fees, and entertainment. Miscellaneous expenses include, but are not limited to, spirit sticks, decorations, pep rally outfits, meals, and special events (Costs may be offset by fundraising which begins shortly after tryouts).

- o Estimate of Initial Cheerleading Expenses \$8000- \$18000

Time Commitment is a requirement for an EMSISD Cheerleader. Mandatory practices begin about 2-3 weeks after tryouts and continue through summer. Cheerleaders practice two to four days a week after school in the Spring. Summer practices will be scheduled as deemed necessary by coordinator. Back to school practices begin in early August. Cheerleaders are required to attend all football games, home basketball games, competitions, and any other functions required by the coordinators or sponsors. Cheerleaders are required to take the 8th period cheer class. It is the responsibility of the cheerleader to share athletic schedules between cheer and students' classes. Excused absences will only be granted with prior communication between athlete and coach.

Physical injury is a personal risk that every cheerleader and their parent must consider. These risks include, but are not limited to muscle pulls, dislocation, broken bones, and catastrophic injuries such as paralysis or even death.

Dug testing is a requirement for all Cheerleaders at EMSISD.

Rules and regulations are stated in the Eagle Mountain Saginaw ISD Cheerleading Constitution. An EMSISD Cheerleader is required to abide by those requirements stated within as long as he/she is a member of the team.
